RE: LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

We offer the following suggestions to assist you in filling out a successful scholarship application. The application forms are available in the school counseling office.

1. Read the newsletter carefully and select the scholarships for which you qualify.
2. Request two letters of recommendations. You must request in person, NOT on Naviance. Make requests early as people need time to write these letters. Use the "Recommendation Request Form" attached to request these letters. Your completed "Activity Form" or resume will assist the letter writer as they write about your activities. Teacher recommendations are not required unless specified.
3. Suggest on the "Recommendation Request Form" that the letter be headed "TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN". Then you can use the letter for other scholarships with permission.
4. **You are responsible** for making copies of your recommendations and for seeing that all necessary attachments are with the applications when you return them to the school counseling office. **Do exactly as you are asked** -- do not add anything that is not requested.
5. Parents must sign the attached transcript request form for the release of your academic records to the scholarship committees. Make sure all scholarships that you are applying for are checked off on the release form. Return this form with your completed applications.
6. Please be certain that applications are completed as directed and that all questions are answered accurately. **Proofread** for spelling and errors. Do not leave any spaces blank.
7. If you are applying for scholarships using the **general application form**, complete the entire form **except for the space requesting the scholarship title**. **Duplicate for the required number of scholarships needed and then supply the title.**
8. There is no charge for the transcripts that are used for the local scholarship program.
9. **Students are encouraged to submit their completed scholarship packets prior to the deadline listed below.**

JEANNETTE CADWALLADER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP – one \$500 scholarship to a senior with a minimum GPA of 3.00, who is planning to pursue secondary education as a major and/or English, journalism or pre-law. Extra curricular involvement as well as financial need will be considered. Priority will be given to students who are currently being raised in a single-parent home.

FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL'S SCHOLARSHIP - A \$500.00 scholarship will be awarded to any student planning to seek further education; criteria: academic achievement and financial need; positive contribution to the school.

FRANKLIN GARDEN CLUB - \$500.00 scholarship to a student who wishes to continue his/her education in landscape design, horticulture, or environmental sciences. Criteria for selection are community service, academic achievement, and financial need.

RAYMOND S. HYSON - Available to all seniors planning to attend any accredited institution of higher learning. This includes colleges and universities, as well as schools for vocational and commercial training. Awards will be paid directly to the institution selected by the recipient. Awards range in value from approximately \$400.00 to \$1,000.00. The criteria used to determine awards are academic achievement, citizenship, personal traits, and financial need.

L. LEE LINDLEY AND GAY F. LINDLEY MEMORIAL - Open to all seniors planning further education in any accredited institution for any vocation. Criteria for selection are average or above grades, good school attendance, participation in school and community activities, financial need, and promise of success. (Amount - \$500.00)

NATURALAWN OF AMERICA - A scholarship of \$350.00 is available to a senior planning to major in some area of the life sciences (forestry, biology, etc.): grade point average and financial need will be considered.

PHI BETA KAPPA ALUMNI ASSOCIATION OF GREATER BALTIMORE - \$200.00 scholarship for a Franklin High School senior planning to attend college with a planned major in the Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Science, Mathematics, or Arts with a grade point average of 3.75 and excellent writing skills.

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REISTERSTOWN ELEMENTARY PTA/IVAN C. NOLTE MEMORIAL - \$500.00 to a senior planning further education in any academic field. Criteria for selection are scholastic and personal potential and financial need. Applicants must have attended Reisterstown Elementary School for a minimum of three years.

REISTERSTOWN SENIOR CENTER - One \$500 scholarship available to a senior pursuing post-secondary education - could include trade school, community college or four year college.

MARY TAYLOR - Open to any senior who is planning to further his/her education in the arts and who has financial need. Amount \$250.00.

Scholarships available via the Franklin High School general application -- decision will be made by an OUTSIDE ORGANIZATION COMMITTEE.

1. Use Franklin High School "General Scholarship Application".
2. A separate application must be completed for **EACH** scholarship.
3. Leave name of sponsor blank -- complete one application -- photocopy as many as necessary -- then, fill in name of each scholarship sponsor.
4. Each application must include **two recommendations**.

A.P. STATISTICS SCHOLARSHIP: One \$250 scholarship will be offered to a Franklin High student enrolled in A.P. Statistics.

DR. SCOTT L. BAYLIN DDS SCHOLARSHIP -- Scholarship to be awarded to a Franklin High student who will attend Indiana University in Bloomington Indiana or Wisconsin University in Madison, WI. Applicant will be evaluated on academic achievement and community service.

ELITE DRIVING SCHOOL -- Available to a Franklin High School student who is currently enrolled or has completed the Elite Driving School program. Amount: \$500.

FRANKLIN ELEMENTARY PTA - Offering a scholarship up to \$500.00 to any senior interested in continuing his/her education. Student must have high quality academic credentials, extensive extracurricular activities and/or community service. The student must have attended Franklin Elementary at least three years. Financial need is a component, but not a requirement. Two scholarships may be awarded.

FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL MATH HONOR SOCIETY -- One \$200 scholarship awarded to members of Franklin High School Math Honor Society. Selection based on academic achievement, community service and financial need.

FUTURE EDUCATORS OF AMERICA -- One \$500.00 scholarship awarded to members of Franklin High School's FEA. Selection based on academic achievement, community service, and financial need.

OPTIMIST CLUB OF REISTERSTOWN/OWINGS MILLS -- At least two \$500.00 scholarships will be awarded on a competitive basis. Consideration will be given to academic achievement, community service, leadership, and financial need. Prefer a student with at least a "B" average. Extra curricular school activities are also considered in selection process.

JOHN F. OWINGS SR. MEMORIAL - Available to all seniors. An award will be granted to a deserving senior who is interested in the teaching field. Criteria are: will attend Towson University, financial need, good school attendance, and scholastic achievement. Scholarship may be renewed each year. (Amount: \$300.00 per year)

DORIS PORTS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP -- One \$1000.00 scholarship is available to seniors planning to pursue further education at an accredited college or school. Criteria for selection are academic achievement, community service and financial need.

REISTERSTOWN AREA RECREATION COUNCIL - Will award two \$1,000.00 or one \$2,000.00 scholarship, to seniors seeking further education at any accredited institution. The criteria: scholarship, participation in extracurricular activities, and participation in activities sponsored by the Reisterstown Area Recreation Council. **List the Recreation Council activities on your completed application.**

TODD W. SEABOLD SCHOLARSHIP OF THE GLYNDON UNITED METHODIST CHURCH - This scholarship has been established in memory of Mr. Seabold who was a Franklin High School graduate. The scholarship will be in the amount of approximately \$750.00 and will be awarded to a Franklin High School senior who intends to major in the field of international or foreign studies, and has a demonstrated financial need.

KENNETH SILBERMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship has been established in memory of Kenneth Silberman who was a student at Glyndon Elementary School, when he died of a brain tumor in 1993. The scholarship will be in the amount of \$1,000 and will be awarded to a Franklin High School senior who attended Glyndon Elementary School and who is planning to continue his/her education in one of the creative arts (music, art or writing).

ST. LUKE'S UNITED METHODIST CHURCH: St. Luke's United Methodist Church offers an award for a senior at Franklin High School who has attended the St. Luke's Methodist Church. Amount: \$100.00.

STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL - One \$500.00 scholarship will be awarded to a senior involved in the SGA for at least 3 years as either a homeroom representative or alternate, member of the Executive Board or an elected officer. Involvement in student government activities as well as participation, leadership, and initiative within the SGA that transcends normal participation will be considered.

BURNELL WIDDERICH MEMORIAL - A scholarship of approximately \$350.00 is available to a senior who is planning further education at an accredited institution. Criteria for selection are scholarship and personal potential. Preference will be given to varsity athletes, specifically members of Franklin's soccer teams.

WOMAN'S CLUB OF GLYNDON - To be awarded to a senior boy or girl who is planning to further his/her education at an accredited institution. Criteria for selection are leadership qualities, charitable service, scholarship achievement, and financial need.

Return completed applications to the school counseling office not the organization. ***Our deadline supersedes any other deadline listed on individual applications.**

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION OF FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL – Five or more scholarships will be awarded: one or more \$1,000.00 scholarships from the Franklin Alumni Association. All will be available to a senior accepted to any 4 year or 2 year college or trade/technical school. Selection based on financial need, scholastic achievement, citizenship and personal traits. To apply, submit the written application with two letters of recommendation. At least one scholarship will be awarded to a senior planning to attend a trade/technical school and at least one senior planning to attend a 2-year college.

AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY UNIT 116 - One scholarship of \$1,000.00 to aid in further education in a trade, technical or baccalaureate level. Attach a letter to the committee which indicates why you need/deserve this scholarship.

AMERICAN LEGION POST 116 – A scholarship of \$500.00 to aid in further education in a trade, technical or baccalaureate level. The criterion is a son, daughter, or grandchild of an honorably discharged veteran with financial need.

CEDARMERE ELEMENTARY PTA - Available to a senior planning further education who has demonstrated leadership, academic development, and participation in extra curricular activities. Student must have attended Cedarmere Elementary for at least two years and must have graduated from the school. This year one \$750.00 and one \$250.00 scholarship will be available. Essay required.

CHARTLEY HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION - a \$1000.00 grant entitled the Joseph S. Molinaro Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to a senior who plans to further his education and whose parents are dues-paying members of the Association. A second \$1000 grant entitled the Phyllis Daly Memorial Scholarship is available to students who plan to pursue an English major in college. Interested students should complete the application which will ask about school and community contributions and accomplishments. Forms are available from the Association and the FHS School Counseling Office.

PATRICK J. CITRONI LIBERTY FOUNDATION - Open to students in grade 12 who are enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school, or home study program, in Maryland, who will be attending a college, university, or technical school in Maryland. An essay is required and needs to be accompanied by a cover sheet.

CLASS OF 2010 SCHOLARSHIP –The Class of 2010 is offering two \$250.00 scholarships. These scholarships will be awarded to one female and one male member of the Class of 2014 who has demonstrated exemplary character and values while attending Franklin High School. Students may use this scholarship towards any post secondary educational experience including 2-year colleges, 4-year colleges or trade and technical institutions.

CLASS OF 2014 SCHOLARSHIP - The Class of 2014 is offering two scholarships. Complete the Franklin High School General Application and attach the appropriate essay listed below.

1. The first scholarship will be awarded to a class officer in the amount of \$500. An essay, 500 words or less, on "What have you gained from being a class officer?" is required for consideration.

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2. The second scholarship is available to any senior who applies for it, in the amount of \$500. The student must have demonstrated service to the school or community, have been involved in extra-curricular activities and write an essay, 500 words or less, on "How have you demonstrated the motto 'Nulli Secundus' (Second to none) in your time as a Franklin Indian?"

FRANKLIN ATHLETIC BOOSTERS - Scholarships awarded to students who have participated on sports teams at FHS. Several scholarships will be available to student athletes. The scholarships are available to any senior seeking vocational, commercial, or academic training who is a member of the FHS Athletic Boosters.

FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL PTSA - Several scholarships are available to seniors planning further education. Student and/or parent must be a member of the Franklin High School PTSA. Applications of non-members will NOT be considered. Students must have good academic achievement and demonstrate the characteristics of leadership, integrity, service, commitment and perseverance in school and the community. Two letters of recommendation are required. Include an essay of 50 to 300 words describing how you demonstrate these characteristics and how they support your educational goals. Interviews may be required of scholarship finalists.

FRANKLIN MIDDLE SCHOOL PTA - Two \$500.00 scholarships are available to seniors planning further education who have attended Franklin Middle School. Students should have a G.P.A. of 3.0 or better and have strong community service and extracurricular activities. Awards will be available to seniors at FHS, OMHS, Carver, Towson High & Western HS.

GLYNDON ELEMENTARY PTA - Two \$250.00 scholarships are available to seniors planning education beyond high school and who have been accepted by an accredited institution. Additional criteria are that a student must have maintained a G.P.A. of 3.0 or better; must be well-rounded, demonstrating participation in areas of community service/work or volunteer endeavors and/or extracurricular activities. Any significant award, achievement, honor or recognition should be noted. Financial need not a prerequisite. Student must have attended Glyndon Elementary for three full scholastic years.

IONIC LODGE #145 A.F. & A.M. - A \$500.00 scholarship will be awarded to a senior who can demonstrate academic achievement and financial need. At least one letter of recommendation from a teacher is required for Part VI of the application.

KIWANIS CLUB OF REISTERSTOWN - Two \$1,000.00 scholarships will be available to seniors who plan to study at any approved school including vocational or trade schools. The principal consideration of the committee in selecting the winners is the need for financial assistance. Other criteria for selection are character, leadership, scholastic standing, ability and promise of success.

MASONIC CHARITIES OF MARYLAND, INC. - GRAND LODGE OF A.F. & A.M. OF MARYLAND - A \$500.00 scholarship will be awarded to a senior who can demonstrate academic achievement, leadership in both school and community and a need for financial assistance. At least one letter of recommendation from a teacher is required for Part VI of the application.

MENORAH B'NAI B'RITH LODGE - A \$300.00 scholarship will be awarded based upon an essay, academic achievement, extracurricular activity, and financial need. The student must be of the Jewish faith. The student must write an essay of 500 words based upon the topic indicated on the application form. (Use the FHS general application and the one-page B'NAI B'RITH Scholarship Application Instructions).

PINDER LEGAL TEAM SCHOLARSHIP – One \$500 scholarship to a Franklin High School senior that will be attending a *community college* in Maryland. Students must write a 500-1000 word essay on distracted driving and submit it along with the application.

REISTERSTOWN LIONS CLUB ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS - Two academic scholarships available to male or female students who have maintained a satisfactory academic record. Criteria: scholarship, achievement, personal potential and financial need. The two scholarships will have a dollar value of at least \$1,000.00 each. Applicants should use the standard Reisterstown Lions Club application.

FRED COOPER UNIT SCHOLARSHIP FUND: One \$1,000.00 scholarship to be given to a qualified student, male or female, pursuing an academic or vocational education. *Must be a son/daughter or grandchild of a Reisterstown Lions Club member.* Applicants should use the Fred Cooper Unit Scholarship application.

REISTERSTOWN/OWINGS MILLS/GLYNDON CHAMBER OF COMMERCE - One \$500.00 scholarship open to any senior attending an accredited 2 or 4 year college or vocational program. Criteria are financial need, grades, community involvement and business focus in school or in future scholastic pursuits. The scholarship is renewable for all 4 years of college.

MARTIN J. SMITH FOUNDATION - A scholarship valued at \$1,000.00 (renewable for 3 years) is available to a senior who demonstrates scholastic merit and financial need; and who is also active in the school and community.

MARTHA TOVELL VON GUNTEN - Established for Franklin High Students to aid worthy students who plan to major in voice, piano, organ or music education while attending a college or university.

ERNEST E. WOODEN EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC. - Four scholarships up to \$1,750.00 each available to seniors seeking further education at any accredited institution including vocational training. Criteria: financial need and demonstrated ability to achieve, school and community involvement and leadership traits exhibited. Students must complete the application in its entirety, including using "none" or "N/A" where applicable. Applications that are not complete will not be considered.
